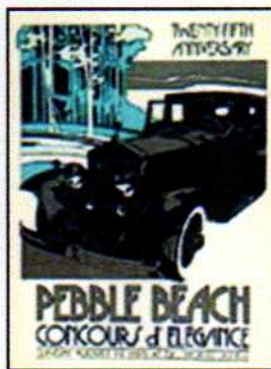
PHILATELIC EXHIBIT AT THE BLACKHAWK

The Blackhawk Museum currently features the special Smithsonian philatelic exhibit *Trailblazers & Trendsetters: Art of the Stamp*. This exhibit, created for the National Postal Museum of Washington D.C., contains 76 original works of art, created by 42 artists, that became U.S. postage stamps. The exhibit is divided into five galleries: Sports; Arts & Entertainment; Transportation; History & Exploration; and Literature.



Located at 3700 Blackhawk Plaza Circle, Danville, California 94506, the Blackhawk Museum is open Wednesday through Sunday from 10AM to 5PM. Admission fees are: \$10 for adults; \$7 for students (with valid ID); \$7 for seniors (65 & older); free for Children under 6 (must be accompanied by a paid adult); and free for active military personnel. The museum phone number is (925)736-2280.

As a not for profit 501(c)(3) organization, the Blackhawk specializes in automotive exhibits and research. Their mission is to "ensure that significant automotive treasures blending art, technology, culture and history would be exhibited for public enjoyment and educational enrichment. automotive museum." Onsite is the Automotive Research Library and a Museum Shop & Book Store. At any given time, they typically have 90 automobiles on exhibit. Evidently, many of the cars on exhibit are also shown during the exclusive annual Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance show in August.

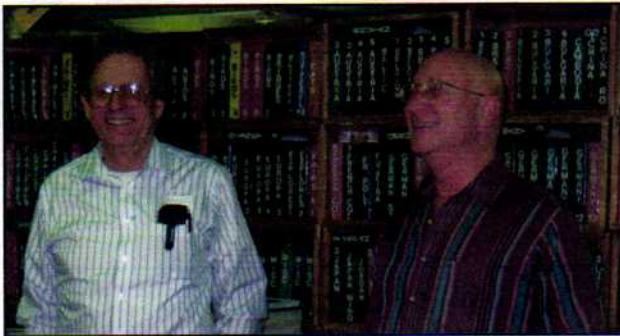

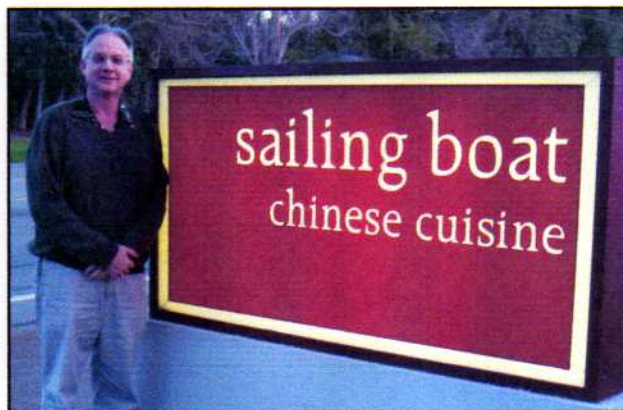

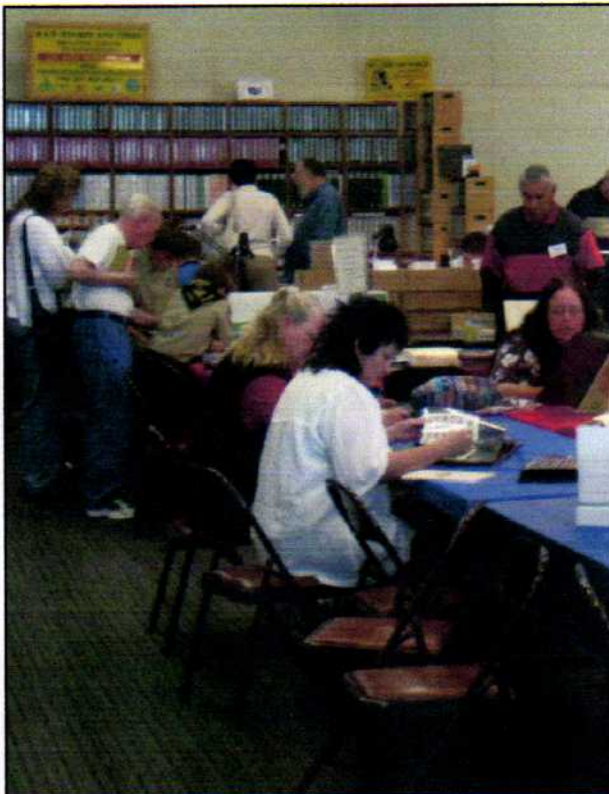

CNCPS MEETING MINUTES: 1 NOVEMBER 2008

The 4th Qtr. Meeting of the Council was called to order by President Vesma Grinfelds at 12:10PM on Saturday November 1, 2008, at SACAPEX in Sacramento. All officers were present except the vice president. There were representatives from five clubs present, an official quorum.

The minutes of the prior meeting were approved as printed in the Council Courier, with a minor correction.

Treasurer Frank Scudero gave a financial report, which was accepted as read. He announced that notices of dues payable would be going out to all clubs in November and December.

President Vesma announced that the Chaloner Award winner for 2008 has been selected, that the trophy is at the engravers, and that the recipient's name would be announced at a forthcoming stamp club function where that person would be present.

She also announced that the Nevada Stamp Study Society has material donated to them that they are willing to trade with any club that is interested. Just contact them.

A letter from the Acting Chairman of COALPEX was distributed to the members present. It outlined the problems COALPEX is facing this year, and possibly future years. Mainly, no leaders to take over running the show. The Council noted the problem, but took no action at this time.

President Vesma announced that she had secured a donation from WESTPEX to construct two boxes to house the show frames. These will replace the single box that now houses all the frames, and make it more convenient to move them.

The 1st Qtr. Meeting of the Council will be at FRESPEX. FRESPEX has a new director this year – everyone is urged to support the show.

A discussion was held on establishing a memorial award at WESTPEX in Leonard Holmsten's name. Several ideas were presented and there will be further discussion.

October 24: EBCC at 12:00 noon
December 6: PENPEX at 12:00 noon

The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 PM.

On the old matter of COALPEX, David McNamee reported that a local dealer wants to hold a show on or about the usual COALPEX date. The consensus of the clubs involved with COALPEX was that a bourse or show would be OK, but not in the name of COALPEX. COALPEX is expected to resume next year.

The Fresno club representative explained some of the difficulties in putting on the FRESPEX show, and requested Council support with contacts and exhibits for next year's show.

President Vesma requested that the Council clubs check their supply of literature for the freebie table and organize volunteers to sit at the table during WESTPEX.

The next Council meeting will be at WESTPEX on April 26th at noon. There will also be a workshop.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:15 PM.
